PRESIDENT'S NOTES

Our year-long preparation for the Joint Conference on Comparative Journalism is about to be tested in a month. We have overcome continuing uncertainties entailing the changing political situations in Korea. Our conference, as an academic endeavor, will be held as originally scheduled in Seoul for two days, August 11 and 12.

For the eventual opening of this conference, I feel grateful to Dr. Byoung-Ku Hahn, president of the Korean Society for Journalism and Communication Studies, and his officers. They have shared with us a belief in the merit of having an opportunity to exchange scholarly views between our members here and our colleagues in Korea.

The KACA members planning to attend the conference have been positive and enthusiastic toward the event. Individual expenses to be incurred are substantial. Accommodating foreign travels to academic schedules is not simple, either. However, their commitment to scholarly interest has been a major concern in their decision to attend the meeting. I believe this occasion will become one of probing joint-research ideas in addition to exchanging views.

The conference takes a comparative approach to studying journalism in Korea and the United States. Our members will present papers on American journalism along such dimensions as journalism education, press laws, gatekeeping processes, and evolution of the press. Counterparts will be made by the scholars in Korea.

Our members planning the trip to Seoul are Dr. Won H. Chang of Missouri, Dr. Tae Guk Kim of North Texas State, Dr. Seong H. Lee of Appalachian State, and I. Dr. Kyoon Hur of Texas may join, too. The meeting site is likely to be one of the following three candidates: Academy House, the Academy of Korean Studies, and Togo Hotel.

The proceedings of the conference will be published in a certain format. With this publication, our association closes the year 1979-80 and opens the next as well. All members are invited to suggest feasible projects or activities the association can pursue during the year 1980-81. If you have such ideas, please contact me or Dr. Seong H. Lee.
