- All author names, email addresses, affiliations, & departments in the order as they appear on the paper.
- Corresponding author name & contact info (e-mail address, mailing address, & phone #)

 Word count: 8,000 words maximum (excluding references, figures, and tables)

 Format: Times New Roman, double-spaced, 12-point font, 1-inch margins

2022 KACA-KOFICE Conference Report



David Tae Yong Cho Memorial Scholarship

The late Rev. Cho's grandchild, Dr. David C. Jeong, <u>shared a message</u> to honor his grandfather and his legacy in the field of Journalism.

About the Rev. David Tae Yong Cho

The Rev. David Tae Yong Cho, age 90, passed away on Jan. 13, 2022, in Los Angeles, surrounded by his loving wife, Elizabeth, children, and grandchildren. He was born on Dec. 24, 1931, in Ichon in present-day North Korea.

The Rev. Cho was a graduate of Yonsei University (Political Science, B.A.) and Korea University (Business, M.B.A.). As a high school student, he enlisted in the South Korean Army as a student volunteer during the Korean War in 1950-1953.



It was during the Korean War that the 38th parallel was drawn between North and South Korea, forever separating him from his parents and siblings in the North. He received a Korean equivalent of a Purple Heart and a Medal of Freedom for his bravery and personal injuries incurred in the Korea War. His war experiences propelled him into a life of politics, journalism, and press freedom [in Korea?]

The Rev. Cho married his college sweetheart, Elizabeth, in Seoul on Dec. 5, 1959. In Korea, he served as editor-in-chief of several newspapers and publications, including the Dokseo Press, Samsung Press, and Kookmin Ilbo. He emigrated to the United States in 1975 and started a new life in Oahu, Hawaii. In Hawaii, he led countless non-profit efforts and service initiatives, such as for the unification of North and South Korea, the advocacy of Korean-American rights and issues, as well as the Olympic Planning Committee for the 1988 Seoul Olympics.

In the early '90s, the Rev. Cho began a rigorous series of coursework that culminated in his ordainment as a pastor and conferral of a doctoral degree in theology. His educational background included: Faith Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, Master of Divinity ('92); Evangelical Presbyterian Churches in the US, Certificate of Ordination ('93); Faith Theological Seminary in California, Master of Theology ('95); and American Theological Seminary, Lit.D ('00). He combined his passion for the press/media and his Christian faith by founding and directing the Korean Christian Broadcasting Network in Hawaii and serving in leadership positions in the Korean Christian Broadcasting Association. The Rev. Cho was fiercely proud of his service in the Korean Army and served as director of the Korean War Veterans Association.

The Rev. Cho loved Christmas (his birthday was Christmas Eve), eating cold noodles (naengmyun), and going to the beach.

The Rev. Cho is survived by his wife (Elizabeth), daughter (Mary), sons (John and Paul), son-in-law (Sam), daughter-in-law (Romy and Josephine), and grandchildren (David, Esther, Jayden).


