# Editorial Column: Does an Experiment Continue?

When you open this newsletter, you may be surprised to find that it is written in English. The last issue was written exclusively in Korean. You may be also discontent that this newsletter does not carry much detailed professional news.

In August 1994, the then-new KACA president Jong K. Kang and the current editor decided to change the format of the KACA newsletter dramatically. This decision was based on a discussion at a business meeting held during the 1994 IAMCR convention in Seoul. At this meeting, participants discussed 1) whether we should use English or Korean in the newsletter and 2) how to handle the huge amount of professional news coming in from members. This news included conference papers presented, new articles and book chapters published, and grants, awards and fellowships received, etc. So, after consulting several senior members, we decided to use Korean for the Fall 1994 newsletter and to reduce members' professional trivia significantly, replacing it with more personal and human interest news. As an outgoing editor, I feel I need to explain the arguments embedded in this editorial change. At the business meeting in Seoul, we argued that the editorial policy of English-only tends to slow down and hinder communication between members. For instance, the majority of KACA members were less likely to respond when they were solicited for editorial opinions. Newly arrived Korean students are especially hesitant to join the association. Since English is not their mother tongue, they might not feel ethnic affinity for English-speaking or English-writing-only Koreans or Korean Americans. These students might feel cultural or psychological distance from the association.

Participants in the meeting also noted that the professional news section was somewhat messy. After the meeting, some even mentioned another member's regrets that the KACA news section was filled with public relations stuff. As an editor, I do not have a problem with any members using this newsletter as a promotional tool to diffuse her or his scholarship. In fact, former presidents and editors encouraged us to share our professional activities. It is also true that the members have not shared personal news much. Thus, previous editors had some difficulty in filling space; two-thirds of the previous newsletters were filled with this sort of professional news. When KACA was small, we enjoyed celebrating our members' superior academic performances through the newsletter. Now this celebration seems to have become a problem. As the size of membership grows beyond 120, the volume of KACA members' scholarly and professional activities has expanded enormously. Last year, for example, several members sent three or four pages of academic activities, single-spaced, to the newsletter. It seemed they sent vitaes.

One option to deal with this large volume of professional news might be to exercise the editor's power and recognize profound scholarship only. While this option was seriously considered, President Kang recommended not to include any news related to articles published or papers presented at the conference, including instead only each member's major academic achievements.

Based on this recommendation, the Fall 1994 newsletter was produced mainly in Korean and any information regarding articles published and papers presented was excluded. Of course, these editorial changes were experimental and temporary. Thus, we asked your comments on this issue and solicited opinions. Although we have not received any written comments, oral opinions seemed to be split. Several members, especially graduate students, appreciated the editorial change, particularly the inclusion of the job related news. But two senior members expressed reservations about the change from English to Korean.

So this time, we decided to use English only in the newsletter as an additional experiment. Following this experiment, we would like to discuss this editorial issue intensively in coming business meetings in Albuquerque in May and Washington, D.C., in August. Dr. Kyu Chan Jeon, who received his degree in Madison, Wisconsin, has been appointed a senior research fellow at the Institute of Korean Broadcasting Development since 1993.

Dr. Jae Kyoung Lee has been appointed an assistant professor at Iwha Women's University. Previously, he worked as a senior research fellow at the Korean Press Institute. Dr. Seung Soo Kim

from England has been appointed an assistant professor at the Chonbuk National University and teaches international communication. Professor Choong Hyun Kim from the University of North Dakota Business School moved to Sogang University in March and will take charge of its advertising program. Professor Seung Mock Yang moved to Seoul National University from Chungnam National University in Taejon. Professor Jae Chul Shim from Kansas City, Missouri, has been invited to Korea University and plans to move there this summer.

### Taik Sup Auh Becomes a KSJCS President

Former active KACA member, Professor Taik Sup Auh will become president of the Korean Society for Journalism and Communication Studies, which represents hundreds of journalism and communication scholars in South Korea. Auh, who has served as a president-elect for the 1994/95 academic year, will succeed Kwang-jae Lee (Kyonghee U) at the KSJCS meeting in May. According to information from Seoul, Auh plans to expand organizational activities to the global level and will publish a new KSJCS journal in English.

Auh received his doctoral degree at Indiana University in Bloomington in 1976 and taught at the Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond for three years. Auh moved to Seoul in 1980 and worked at the *Joongang Daily* for one year to advance its electronic information system. Since then, he has taught at Korea University for 14 years.

The first NAAKCS newsletter published in January 1978 recognized his research contribution to the field as a member of the North American Association of Korean Communication Scholars, which was the former organization of KACA. The newsletter wrote "Taik Sup Auh, Virginia Commonwealth, presented a paper on Issue Conflict and Mass Media Agenda-setting at the 1977 AEJ convention, Madison, Wisconsin." KACA congratulates Dr. Auh for his new presidency in Seoul and is happy to support KSJCS's global activities.

#### Unron kwa Sahoe Seeks Manuscripts

The *Unron kwa Sahoe*, which could be translated "journalism and society," seeks manuscripts relevant to journalism and communication research. Articles should be fully developed theoretical statements and research hypotheses supported by strong arguments and empirical evidence that advance human understanding of communication processes.

According to the editor, the journal holds no biases with respect to micro or macro level phenomena, administrative or critical scholarship, and basic or applied studies. It seeks original ideas and scholarly work that emerge from diverse traditions but intersect at the point of communication theory. The editor welcomes the highest quality work in any subject or method as long as problems in communication theory and research are central. Similar to any top-ranked social science journal in the U.S., the editor reminds contributors that scholarship and theoretical sophistication need not lead to obscurantism.

The *Unron kwa Sahoe* accepts manuscripts written exclusively in Korean, although it may not rule out manuscripts written in English. Acceptance for publication is highly competitive and the journal's editorial process is known to be highly sophisticated. #### **News of People**

Jong K. Kang (Illinois State) has successfully organized the KACA paper session both in the ICA and AEJMC meetings this year.
